GUIDELINES FOR CHOOSING YOUR CLASSES

Placement is based on the student meeting these guidelines

HONORS ENGLISH 9: Students must have earned primarily "A"s in English 7 and 8

MATH: Students will be placed in the next math level according the Math Placement Sequencing chart and the District Math Assessment Test.

AP BIOLOGY: Students must have earned primarily "A"s in Science 7 and 8. It t is highly recommended that 9th graders be concurrently enrolled in Honors English 9 and Honors Algebra or higher math. *Mandatory summer assignment.*

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: Students must have earned primarily "A"s in English 7 and 8. (Foreign Language is not a HS graduation requirement, but at least 2 years of the same foreign language is an admissions requirement for 4-year colleges)

AP HUMAN GEOGRAPHY: Recommended for students as an introduction to AP level social studies classes Student's must have earned primarily "A"s in History and English

ATHLETICS: Most sports require tryouts to be placed on the team. Students will be placed in a PE class until notified they have officially made the team.

Honors and Advanced Placement courses are very rigorous. Maintaining a healthy and successful balance between your academics, extracurricular activities, and other commitments is very important. Students who commit to Honors and/or AP classes are required to complete the full year long course.
